

Scott Brooksbank Recommendation for Nomination
as an Honored Inductee into the
U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame

Dear Selection Committee,

Without inspired individuals, the sport of Freestyle Skiing would never have become what it is today. Therefore, it is appropriate to honor the leaders and pioneers who have made contributions to the introduction and development of Freestyle Skiing. I am proud to nominate Scott Brooksbank for membership in the Hall of Fame.

Scott is a five-time World Freestyle Champion, coach and visionary. He created the Ski With a Legend program at the Sunday River and Northstar Ski Resorts. He participated in the Challenge of the Legends of Freestyle Tour well into his forties. With over 40 career podium appearances, he has more combined titles than any other Freestyle skier.

After high school in 1969, Scott was continuing his diving career at the University of Minnesota. After the 1970 season he decided academia was not for him, so he took Horace Greeley's advice from 1865 to "Go West young man, go West". Landing in Vail, he lived with three roommates in a two bedroom apartment and worked two part time jobs at night busing tables at The Ore House and La Cave restaurants. During the day he skied hard, pushing his athletic abilities to their limits. He was tenacious, dedicated and disciplined in his training which paid off in 1972. He was the Grand National Champion in both the Moguls and the Combined at Vail's Chevrolet Exhibition Skiing Championships, winning a new Chevy Corvette.

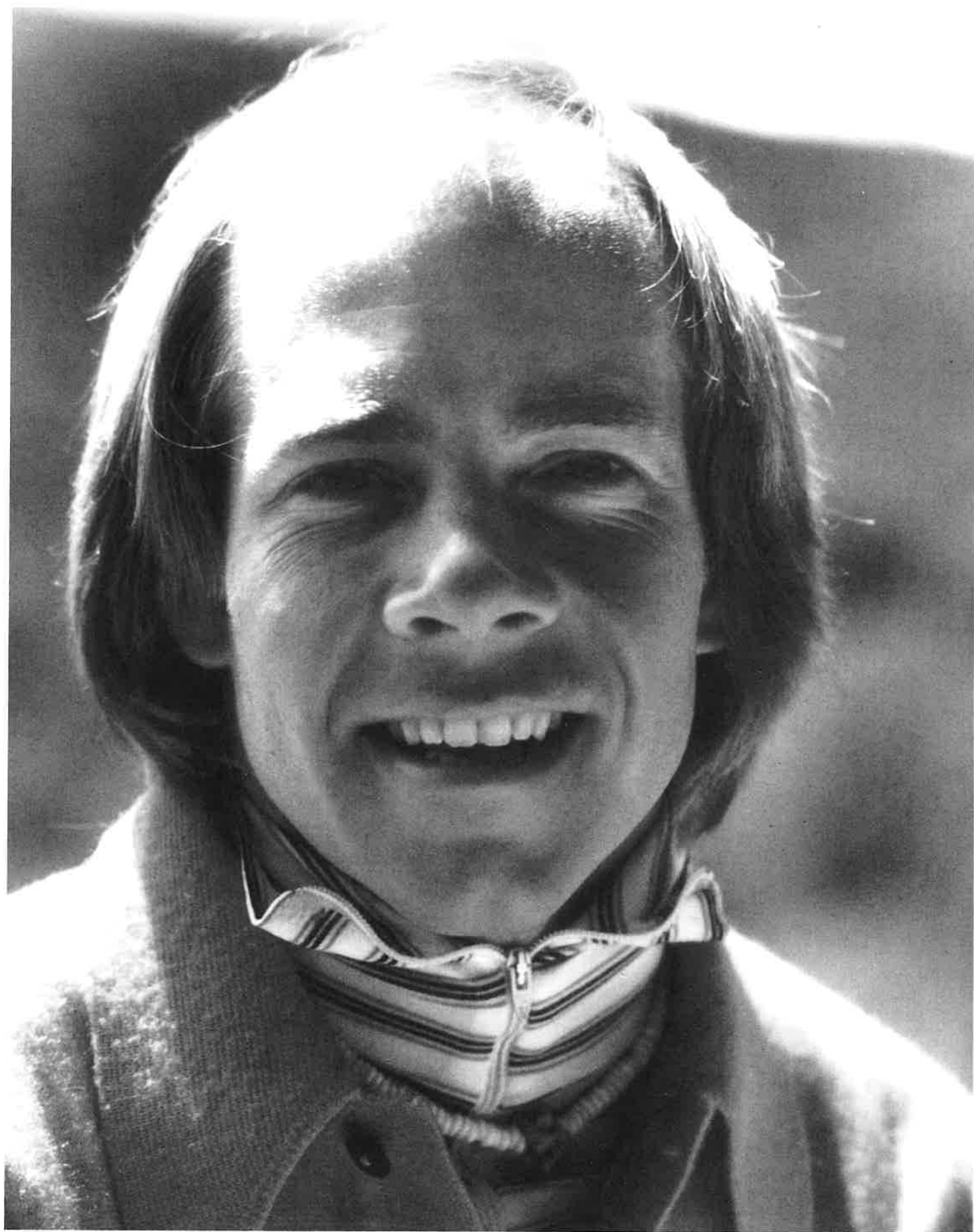
With his easy going personality Scott was a favorite coach at freestyle camps around the world. He is still a Master Coach at Jon Clendenin's camps in Aspen and Park City. This past January, Scott spent several days with his nephew's sons, ages 18 and 13, on their first trip to Park City. After dinner they traded skiing and family stories. Scott told the kids how in 1984 he worked with their father, then just a 14 year old kid from Minnesota; improving the young man's skill and enjoyment of skiing. Now, 35 years later, Scott is working with the next generation.

Scott Brooksbank will be a great addition to the Ski Hall of Fame after almost fifty years performing, coaching and inspiring others to honor and celebrate the sport of skiing.

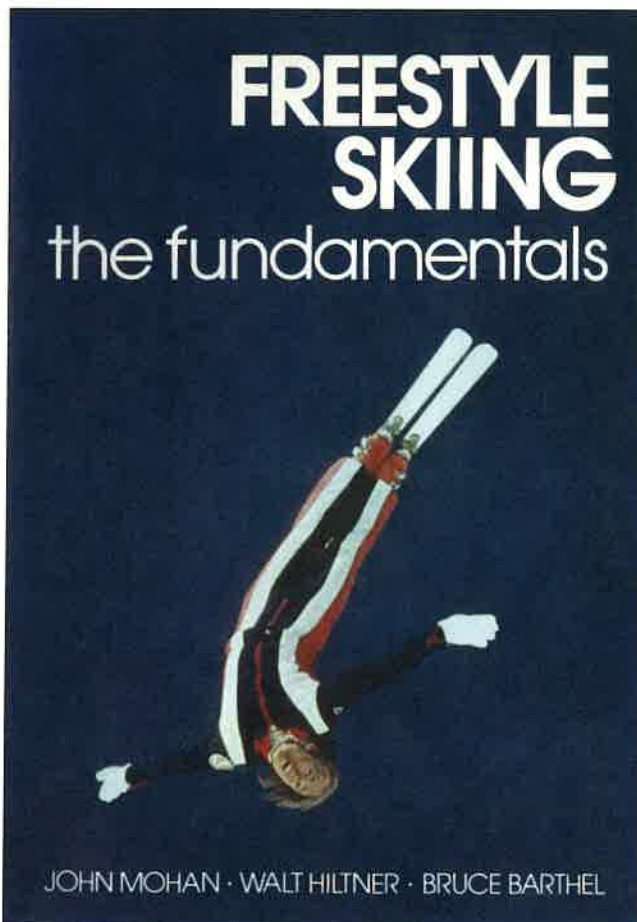

Anecdotes: Scott Brooksbank

Just Another Pretty Face: Often the subject of magazine articles, Scott was on a cover 5 times. And he was the cover shot for Walt Hiltner's hardcover book, *Freestyle Skiing: The Fundamentals* in 1976.

Waiting for Gollner: Scott saw someone skiing down Picture Rock under chair #4. It took two runs to catch up to him. In the middle of Tourist Trap, Herman asked "Why you follow me?" Answer, "You are the best skier on this mountain." Herman asked Scott to finish the run while he watched, and then invited Scott to lunch at the Gold Peak House, where they talked about skiing and pushing yourself to the limit. Two years after winning the Corvette, Scott climbed his way up to Herman's race shack at Stratton Mountain in the pouring rain. Herman opened the door and recognized Scott immediately, then asked "Why you follow me?" They both burst out laughing for several minutes. Scott thanked him for the advice back in Vail, and for the inspiration to be the best skier possible.



Waiting for Gollner 2.0: Rossingnol supported Scott 100% in his efforts to be the first freestyle skier to train with the US Ski Team in Portillo, Chile. The head coach-- Herman Gollner.

Here come da judge: In 1976, Scott and Mark Stegemeier recruited the legendary gymnastic coach at Ohio State, Charlie Pond, to be the head clinician at seminars for event judges. This was a key to maintaining the integrity of the events and the safety of the competitors. Mark was able to incorporate speed points for the moguls, while Scott developed a degree of difficulty chart for aerals and ballet. Charlie Pond was a Head World Cup judge for many years.



Sure he can ski, but can he coach?: Even during his competitive years, Scott was always promoting the sport. As assistant director for Eddie Ferguson's Freestyle Camps at Chrystal Mountain, he coached future competitors and champions the art of aerals. He is working here with a young freestyle hopeful on her first front flip. Is that Marion Post, future multiple World Champion and Female Freestyle Skier of the Year? I believe it is.


